

Mikey Weinstein's Statement**

On the loss of "a great patriot and an even greater human being" who "tremendously helped our MRFF clients in need, particularly medical need, on literally dozens of occasions"

"Today, Ross Perot passed away in the early morning hours from leukemia. Our nation has lost a great patriot and an even greater human being. My family has known the Perot family for 70 years ever since my dad, Jerry Weinstein, met and became extremely close friends and midshipman classmates with Ross during Plebe Summer with the U.S. Naval Academy Class of 1953 in the summer of 1949.

Ross literally knew me before I was even born. I have wonderful childhood memories of him, including when he visited me on several occasions during my cadet years at the USAF Academy. But it was as an adult that I really got to know him.

I worked for him professionally on two occasions and became his first General Counsel at Perot Systems Corporation in the late 1980s after first representing him as legal counsel in my New York City-based law firm. In fact, the second time I worked for Ross, in the early 2000s, became my very last job before starting and directing the Military Religious Freedom Foundation (MRFF).

Speaking of MRFF, though few were aware of it other than those directly concerned, Ross just tremendously helped our MRFF clients in need, particularly medical need, on literally dozens of occasions over the past 14 or 15 years of MRFF's civil rights activism. He absolutely saved several lives in the process. Ross never once refused my requests for him to help one of our MRFF clients. In fact, a number of our MRFF clients have kindly reached out to me today with the news of his passing to recount how profoundly Ross had touched their lives. Some recall how Ross would personally call them on a daily basis in the hospital to make sure they were always getting superior care which, of course, Ross had arranged.

Rest in Peace, Ross Perot.

Your legacy of kindness, compassion, courage, dignity, strength, character and integrity will be everlasting."
